Month	Flowers in Season	Symbolism / Notes	Planning Tip
January	Tulips, Amaryllis, Paperwhites	Tulips = perfect love, renewal; Amaryllis = strength	Plan ahead for post-holiday floral refreshes; tulips begin popping up mid-month.
February	Red Roses, Ranunculus, Anemone	Roses = passion; Ranunculus = charm	Valentine’s Day drives up red rose prices—pre-order early or go for unique shades.
March	Daffodils, Hyacinth, Iris	Daffodils = new beginnings; Iris = faith	Spring weddings? Order by late January to secure early-bloom deals.
April	Peonies, Sweet Peas, Lilac	Peonies = prosperity; Sweet Pea = delicate pleasure	Peonies can be pricy and limited—book early for events.
May	Lily of the Valley, Garden Roses, Stock	Lily = purity; Stock = happy life	Mother's Day favorites—expect demand and limited availability.
June	Roses, Delphinium, Hydrangea	Roses, Delphinium, Hydrangea	Peak wedding season—schedule consultations early in the year.
July	Sunflowers, Zinnias, Dahlias	Sunflowers = loyalty; Zinnia = lasting affection	Perfect for outdoor or rustic themes; strong availability.
August	Marigolds, Cosmos, Gladiolus	Marigold = creativity; Gladiolus = strength	High summer blooms are hearty and vibrant—great for longer events.
September	Asters, Mums, Sedum	Asters = wisdom; Mums = loyalty	Early fall weddings? Consider bold tones and texture combos.
October	Protea, Chrysanthemums, Rosehips	Protea = transformation; Chrysanthemums = abundance	Unique textures perfect for modern or moody floral bars.
November	Calla Lilies, Leucadendron, Carnations	Calla = elegance; Carnation = love	Harvest themes thrive here; rich hues add warmth to any bouquet.
December	Poinsettias, Ilex Berries, Paperwhites	Poinsettia = celebration; Ilex = protection	Winter weddings? Go for whites, reds, and evergreens—book by September.
